

### St. Mark – April 25<sup>th</sup>

St. Mark, the author of the shortest and oldest gospel, is mentioned at least ten times in the Bible, most often as a missionary companion of Paul. Because the events recounted in the Bible happened so long ago, we may have a hard time imagining the people. Add to that the overly pious pictures and saccharine Biblical stories that are often presented to us as children, and it's a wonder any trace of real personality has made it through the centuries. Yet hidden between the lines of Biblical stories are hints of intrigue and controversy. One of the biggest centers on St. Mark.




Mark was apparently a teenager when Jesus was teaching. About the year 46, Paul and Barnabas took him with them on their first missionary journey. Sometime later, Mark decided to return to Jerusalem, much to Paul's disgust. Mark and Paul could not reconcile their differences, and Paul refused to take him along on his second missionary journey.

Why did Mark go home? What made Paul so furious? Although those questions are intriguing, they just skim the surface of the controversy, for it's apparent that later on Mark and Paul were reconciled. In fact, Mark even visited and comforted Paul in prison.

The questions surrounding their reconciliation are even more intriguing than is their argument. Who made the first move? What prompted them to make peace? When we are involved in an angry dispute, let us remember the incident with Mark and Paul. It really doesn't matter who makes the first move, so long as we are willing to meet the other person somewhere in the middle.

### World Day of Prayer for Vocations – April 29



On the fourth Sunday of Easter, Christians are invited to reflect on the meaning of God's call and to pray for vocations. Christ the Good Shepherd continues to lead his people through his Bishops, priests, and deacons, and calls many to follow him in this way. Priestly, diaconal, and religious vocations should be a constant concern in the hearts of God's people throughout the year.

The whole Christian community shares this responsibility for fostering vocations. The first step is to live in a full Christian manner.
