An Act of Spiritual Communion

When unable to receive Holy Communion, one can make a Spiritual Communion. This is an act expressing what was described by St. Thomas Aquinas as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and in lovingly embracing Him." In a Spiritual Communion we ask our Lord to come to us in the same way He would if we were able to receive the Sacrament:

My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Holy Eucharist.

I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.

**Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.**

**I embrace You as if You were already there,
and unite myself wholly to You.**

Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Dear Parishioners!

The recent escalation in influenza cases in Alberta has raised questions about what we in the Church can do to help prevent the spread of this disease. Our bishop Paul advises us of some steps that should be taken in the parishes of the Diocese to take precautions against the spread of infection. We are advised that they should remain in effect at least until the end of January:

- **Discontinue the reception of the Precious Blood** as part of any public celebration of the Eucharist.
- Limit the **reception of the Body of Christ to the hands only**.
- **Suspend the practice of shaking hands during the Sign of Peace**. This can be replaced by a bow or an intentional nod of the head toward those around you.
- **Empty all holy water** fonts.
- Remind parishioners of the importance of basic health measures. For example, thorough hand washing is an effective means of preventing the transmission of infectious material (nasal secretions, saliva, etc.) from soiled hands. Make **alcohol-based hand sanitizing solution or tissues available in the church entrance** (they are available in our church in the entrance by the stairs)
- Encourage all parishioners to **remain home at the first sign of illness**, especially a cough or fever, out of respect for their brothers and sisters. Those who stay home can view a televised Mass on Salt+Light Television, on EWTN Television, or online at **www.canadiandailymass.com**. They can also make a Spiritual Communion; instructions for this are attached in a separate document from the Office of Divine Worship.
- Remind **all lay ministers of the need to practice good hygiene**. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should sanitize their hands immediately before receiving Communion themselves (*sanitizer in placed in the pew where they sit in the sanctuary*) and avoid touching their face or other surfaces such as handrails before distributing Communion. Rub hand sanitizer over the hands until completely dry. (The sanitizer must evaporate or stay on the skin for 10 seconds to achieve any antibacterial/antiviral effect.)
- Inform all pastoral care team members who bring the Blessed Sacrament to shut-ins that they should not attend any homes where influenza is known or suspected to be present.
- All pastoral care visitors to hospitals and nursing homes, whether clergy or lay volunteers, must observe all posted infection control procedures at these institutions (e.g. hand sanitizing, gowning, masking.)

Please note that the decision to impose restrictions on the liturgy was not made lightly. It was based on prayer, reflection and consultation with Alberta Health Services, the agency which is in the best position to assess local conditions and risk. It is bishop's intention to lift the restrictions as soon as the provincial health authorities assure us that the risk of influenza infection has dropped substantially. These measures are also to be implemented at all other institutions in the Diocese where Mass is celebrated.

Please know that these changes are only temporary. We will keep you notified of changes as the situation warrants.

Please also keep in prayers those who are suffering and grieving during this outbreak that Jesus Christ, who is our great physician, may heal them.
